2023 Indiana Legislative Session PARENT WINS!

HB 1447 - Obscene books / materials, Panorama, Activism

This bill has a lot of detail as originally written; the highlights:

INAPPROPRIATE BOOKS / MATERIALS: Removal of obscene or harmful books in school libraries. A person who knowingly disseminates material DESCRIBED IN 35-49-2 (Matter or Performance Harmful to Minors) commits a Level 6 felony.

PANORAMA / THIRD PARTY VENDORS: third-party cannot collect personal information from students

Requires schools to:

- attempt to obtain parent consent at least twice
- post a copy of survey on website
- explain the reason for the survey

INCENTIVISING ACTIVISIM: If a school incentivizes a student to engage in any sort of political activism they can NOT require the student to affirm any action that would result in favoring any particular position on the issue and must also offer an alternative option for students.

HB 1608 - Pre-K - 3 NO Sex discussions and Student Transgender requests

• NO HUMAN SEXUALITY discussion for grades PreK – 3rd grade in classrooms/ schools.

Schools must notify a parent of a student's request to change their name or pronoun.

HB1001 - School Choice Expansion

Expanded eligibility for Choice Scholarships. Allows families to receive vouchers for students to attend private schools raising the family income ceiling from \$154,000 to \$220,000.

Eliminates the eight pathways currently in place to determine student eligibility for the voucher program.

Requires each school corporation to publish high school graduation rates on their website.

HEPL - Hamilton East Public Library

Library estimates roughly half the books in teen section will be moved to adult section due to explicit and inappropriate content

According to members of the Hamilton East Public Library Board of Trustees, "We are moving books that are age-inappropriate for the location that the Librarians chose to puth them. These books will be moved into the general collection of the library, which is accessible by all card holders. This policy will be used with all books purchased in the future."

Micah Beckwith shared with <u>The Daily Signal</u>: "As a board, we have never asked staff to ban or remove any book from the library. All we've asked Hamilton East Public Library staff is to review books that could contain explicit graphic content. If any is found, we are not removing the book, we are just asking that it be placed in the adult section of the library so parents can have a little better grasp on what their children are reading. We welcome all viewpoints at the [Hamilton East Public Library], including those from parents who have voiced their concern that some of the content is too graphic or explicit for their children. We want to be an inclusive and tolerant environment for all."

Indiana's "school choice" voucher program grew 20% last year — with more growth coming

Passed this legislative session, HB 1001 School <u>choice exp</u>ansion

Even more Hoosier students are expected to use vouchers in the next two years due to a program expansion. (HB 1001)

Indiana's private school voucher program grew by 20% in the 2022-23 school year — the largest increase in the number of students in nearly 10 years, according to a new report.

The Indiana Department of Education's (IDOE) annual Choice Scholarship Program analysis released this month showed state funds paid private school tuition for 53,262 Hoosier students.

That's compared to 44,376 students who used vouchers during the 2021-22 academic year.

With that growth came increased costs. The state spent \$311.8 million on the program in the 2022-23 school year — 29% more than the year prior.

Voucher participation and spending are expected to jump even more this fall after state lawmakers expanded the program to be nearly universal and open to almost all Hoosier families.

The broader eligibility provisions are projected to grow the voucher program to some 95,000 students by 2025 — and more than double the state money spent on the Choice Scholarships, costing taxpayers \$1.1 billion over the next two years.

As the program continues to grow, the vouchers are additionally less likely to be linked to lowincome assistance.


In 2022-23, only 28.1% of voucher households had an income below \$50,000, compared to 37.4% in the 2021-22 school year. Instead, most voucher recipient households were more likely to make over \$100,000 than under \$50,000.

"I think it's great that Indiana is funding families and giving opportunities to families from across the income spectrum," said Robert Enlow, president and CEO of EdChoice, an Indianapolis-based group that backs voucher programs. "It's a really good thing to see this growth in the Choice program, and I expect it to grow even more next year."
